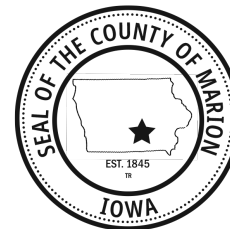

SHALL THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC MEASURE BE ADOPTED?

Summary: To authorize imposition of a local sales and services tax in the City of Knoxville, at the rate of one percent (1%) to be effective on January 1, 2024.

A local sales and services tax shall be imposed in the City of Knoxville, at the rate of one percent (1%) to be effective on January 1, 2024. Revenues from the sales and services tax shall be allocated as follows: Fifty (50%) for property tax relief. The specific purposes for which the revenues shall otherwise be expended are: Fifty (50%) of said local option sales and service tax to be allocated for the following public purposes, to-wit: Capital improvement projects which may include, but not limited to, public safety/city hall facilities, street improvements, park and trail improvements, and related debt service, public safety, economic development, the purchase of capital equipment; building maintenance or expansion, land acquisition and site development determined by need or according to the City of Knoxville Comprehensive Plan; and other community betterment projects or other lawful purposes of the City of Knoxville, Iowa.
