

WHEREAS, Community Project Funding requests (CPF) are Congressionally-directed grants that are included in annual appropriations funding; and

WHEREAS, Congresswoman Mariannette Miller-Meeks can only submit 15 CPF requests to the Appropriations Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Appropriations Committee has the final say in whether a CPF request is included in the FY24 appropriations bill and subject to passage of an appropriations law containing CPFs, and

WHEREAS, Marion County is an eligible applicant and has a need to offset current road funding allocations with discretionary funds such as this to help sustain adequate infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, the proposed transportation improvements recommended for this application of CPFs include the mill and overlay, and minor safety improvements of County Road T17 from Old Hwy 92 to IA Hwy 5, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MARION COUNTY IN THE STATE OF IOWA, THAT THE COUNTY: Endorses the grant application for Congresswoman Miller-Meeks Fiscal Year 2024 community Project Funding request. Commits that the roadway currently is and will continue to be dedicated for public use. Certifies that applicable permits and agreements are or will be secured for the jurisdictional responsibility for the improved primary roadway with the lowa DOT prior to improvements for the roadway maintenance. Certifies a commitment of non-federal fund participation as applicable for 20% of the roadway project.

Dear Representative Miller-Meeks:

The Marion County Board of Supervisors would like to add our voice to support the Pavement Rehabilitation Project on County Road T17, from Old Hwy 92 to IA Hwy 5, that the Marion County Engineer has submitted for the FY2024 Community Project Funding Request.

Marion County is unique in the fact that we have two county seat sizes of towns (Knoxville and Pella) and also lowa's largest lake (Red Rock) within our boarders. As a result of these key features, tourism provides nearly a \$55 Million economic impact to our county. 117 itself is a vital link for Marion County tourism, but also largely services our many manufacturing facilities as a commuter and freight route to the southern part of the County and connecting regionally to Counties to our south. This segment of T17 provides access to one of Marion County Conservations largest recreational areas for public hunting and fishing, a law enforcement firearms training facility, as well as the South Central Iowa Solid Waste Agency which services Marion and four other counties. Additionally, this road provides access to adjacent agricultural facilities, farms, and rural residential areas of our county's manufacturing-based labor force.

Like many rural counties in lowa, Marion County has short comings in transportation funding. Opportunities such as this make such an impact in rural communities that have stretched resources in order to maintain critical infrastructure. This prospective funding is one step closer to being more proactive than reactive in roadway improvements. Therefore, please consider the \$3,200,000 for an 80% cost share in the proposed application for Marion County.

We strongly support the Marion County Engineer in his efforts to seek financial assistance for this extremely important project.



CELEBRATE IOWA FLAG DAY ON MARCH 29TH!

About the Day

Iowa Flag Day is a public holiday and recognition day in Iowa code that exists to reflect on our heritage and celebrate our history. Knoxville holds this day in special significance as the Iowa flag was designed here. This Iowa State Flag Day was declared by the legislature in 1998. In 2015, Governor Terry Branstad proclaimed March 23-29, as Dixie Cornell Gebhardt Week in Iowa.

To honor this day, we are planning an event near Dixie's memorial on the courthouse lawn. This event will include reading of the Governor's proclamation declaring March 29th Iowa Flag Day, reading of the finalist of the "What Does the Iowa Flag Mean to Me?" essay contest, a historical journey of the flag and Dixie speech from the author of "My Name Is Dixie," and table history exhibits, and a passport activity to visit landmarks related to the Iowa Flag



History of the Iowa Flag

The State of Iowa did not have a flag until around 75 years after it became a state. While Iowa had regimental banners for the Civil War, World Fair, and Iowa guardsmen, by 1917 it was still one of three states that did not have an official flag. Dixie, and the Daughters of the American Revolution pressed for this to change. After holding a contest where Dixie's design won and the onset of World War I, Iowa couldn't wait any longer. By March 1921, after years of struggle, Dixie's winning design became the official flag of Iowa.

Purpose of Celebrations

Dixie was a smart, kind, and undeterred woman in a time when woman were not allowed to be that. Her preserverance is the reason we have a flag and is something Knoxville should be proud of. With debates around history as of lately, it's important to remember who we are and come togetherr to celebrate our past and look forward to the future.

RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE NECESSITY AND SETTING DATES OF A CONSULTATION AND A PUBLIC HEARING ON A PROPOSED ADKINS URBAN RENEWAL PLAN FOR A PROPOSED URBAN RENEWAL AREA IN MARION COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA

WHEREAS, it is hereby found and determined that one or more economic development areas, as defined in Chapter 403, Code of Iowa, exist within the County and the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development, or combination thereof, of the area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, or welfare of the residents of the County; and

WHEREAS, this Board has caused there to be prepared a proposed Adkins Urban Renewal Plan ("Plan" or "Urban Renewal Plan") for the Adkins Urban Renewal Area ("Area" or "Urban Renewal Area"), which proposed Plan is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Plan is to form the Adkins Urban Renewal Area suitable for economic development and to include a list of proposed projects to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area, and a copy of the Plan has been placed on file for public inspection in the office of the County Auditor; and

WHEREAS, the property proposed to be included in the Urban Renewal Area is legally described in the Plan and this Board has reasonable cause to believe that the Area described in the Plan satisfies the eligibility criteria for designation as an urban renewal area under Iowa law and; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the area be redeveloped as part of the overall redevelopment covered by the Plan; and

WHEREAS, portions of the land proposed to be included in the Urban Renewal Area is within the corporate boundaries of the City of Pleasantville, Iowa and the County will enter into a joint agreement with the city to allow the County to operate within the proposed Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Urban Renewal Area includes land classified as agricultural land and written permission of the current owners will be obtained; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa statutes require the Board of Supervisors to submit the proposed Urban Renewal Plan to the County Planning and Zoning Commission for review and recommendation as to its conformity with the general plan for development of the County as a whole prior to Board approval of such Plan, and further provides that the Planning and Zoning Commission shall submit its written recommendations thereon to this Board within thirty (30) days of its receipt of such proposed Urban Renewal Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa statutes require the Board of Supervisors to notify all affected taxing entities of the consideration being given to the proposed Urban Renewal Plan and to hold a consultation with such taxing entities with respect thereto, and further provides that the designated representative of each affected taxing entity may attend the consultation and make written recommendations for modifications to the proposed division of revenue included as a part thereof, to which the County shall submit written responses as provided in Section 403.5, Code of Iowa, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa statutes further require the Board of Supervisors to hold a public hearing on the proposed Urban Renewal Plan subsequent to notice thereof by publication in a newspaper having general circulation within the County, which notice shall describe the time, date, place and purpose of the hearing, shall generally identify the urban renewal area covered by the Plan and shall outline the general scope of the urban renewal project under consideration, with a copy of the notice also being mailed to each affected taxing entity.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MARION COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That the consultation on the proposed Urban Renewal Plan required by Section 403.5(2), Code of Iowa, as amended, shall be held on March 20, 2023, in the Board Conference Room, 3014 East Main Street, Knoxville, Iowa, at 10:00 A.M., and County Supervisor Raymie, or his delegate, is hereby appointed to serve as the designated representative of the County for purposes of conducting the consultation, receiving any recommendations that may be made with respect thereto and responding to the same in accordance with Section 403.5(2), Code of Iowa.

Section 2. That the County Auditor is authorized and directed to cause a notice of such consultation to be sent by regular mail to all affected taxing entities, as defined in Section 403.17(1), Code of Iowa, along with a copy of this Resolution and the proposed Urban Renewal Plan, the notice to be in substantially the following form:

That the Chairperson and County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to sign the Joint Agreement included as Exhibit C to the Urban Renewal Plan on behalf of the County, and that the County Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to submit a request to the city council of the City of Pleasantville, Iowa for their approval of the Joint Agreement, with respect to the County's establishment of the proposed Urban Renewal Area within the city's "area of operation," as defined in Iowa Code Section 403.17(4).

Section 7. That the proposed Urban Renewal Plan be submitted to the County Planning and Zoning Commission for review and recommendation as to its conformity with the general plan for the development of the County as a whole, with such recommendation to be submitted in writing to this Board within thirty (30) days of the date hereof.

It is worth noting, however, that there is a great deal of price variation among similar-size lots in Prairie Ridge.

4. Lot Pricing Considerations in Knoxville

A) Lot Size and Parking Location

The typical lot is $50' \times 110$,' or 5,500 SF. They are smaller than most of the lots offered in Pella. The paved alleys and parking access requirements do, however, allow builders to construct a home as large as those that can be found on 75' lots. With the garage in back, however, the yards are much smaller.

The largest lots are $60' \times 110$,' or 6,600 SF. They are located on corner lots. Under the zoning in place, these lots can accommodate a duplex, but are more likely to accommodate single family homes.

The sale of two lots to build a larger home should be allowed, as the larger home would: increase assessment values accordingly; and serve to encourage a greater mix of income types in the District.

B) Local Market Characteristics


- Over the last 10 years, Knoxville has experienced a shortage of lots as no new subdivisions have been developed.
- Currently there are only 10 lots or so for sale in Knoxville subdivisions half of which are condo lots.
- Knoxville has averaged approximately 5 new home starts per year, in part due to the shortage of available lots.
- KEDC is the only local builder to provide spec homes (8 units to date). All other housing starts have been custom homes.
- Knoxville's Median HHI (\$50,000) is only 63% of Pella's (\$80,000). Pella has
 experienced more land and housing development, and equivalent houses
 generally sell for about 20% more than in Knoxville. Current Knoxville households,
 on average, have less capacity to borrow than Pella's.
- With no new subdivisions or spec homes on the market, the Knoxville market is not as aware of the recent price increases in lots and new homes and is likely to resist the higher prices.
- Setting the initial Veterans Lot Prices too high could negatively affect the buildout of the area for many years to come.

C) Need For Early Construction

- · The overriding objectives of this project are to:
 - · Build new houses and increase the property tax base;



- · Attract new residents to Knoxville and increase discretionary spending;
- Encourage employees, business owners, and managers who work in Knoxville but live elsewhere to move here; and
- Take advantage of increased population and discretionary spending to grow Knoxville's commercial base.
- · As such, selling lots and encouraging their construction should be our priority.
